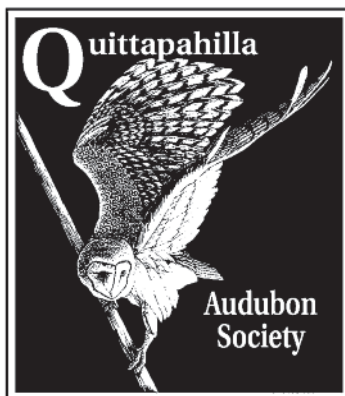

Thanks so much for your continued support.

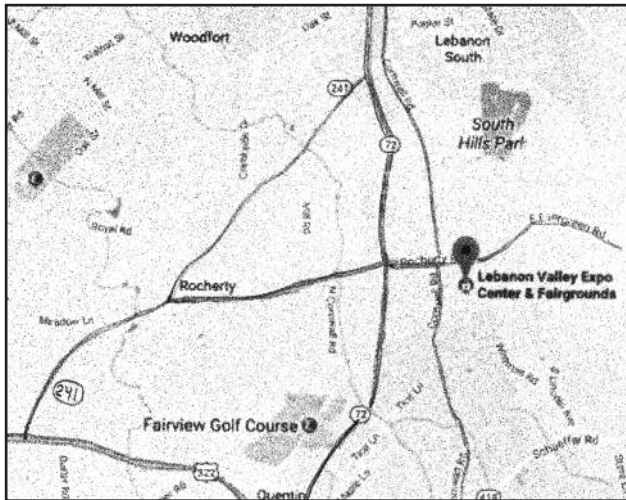

ORDER DEADLINE: The order deadline is October 22, 2021.

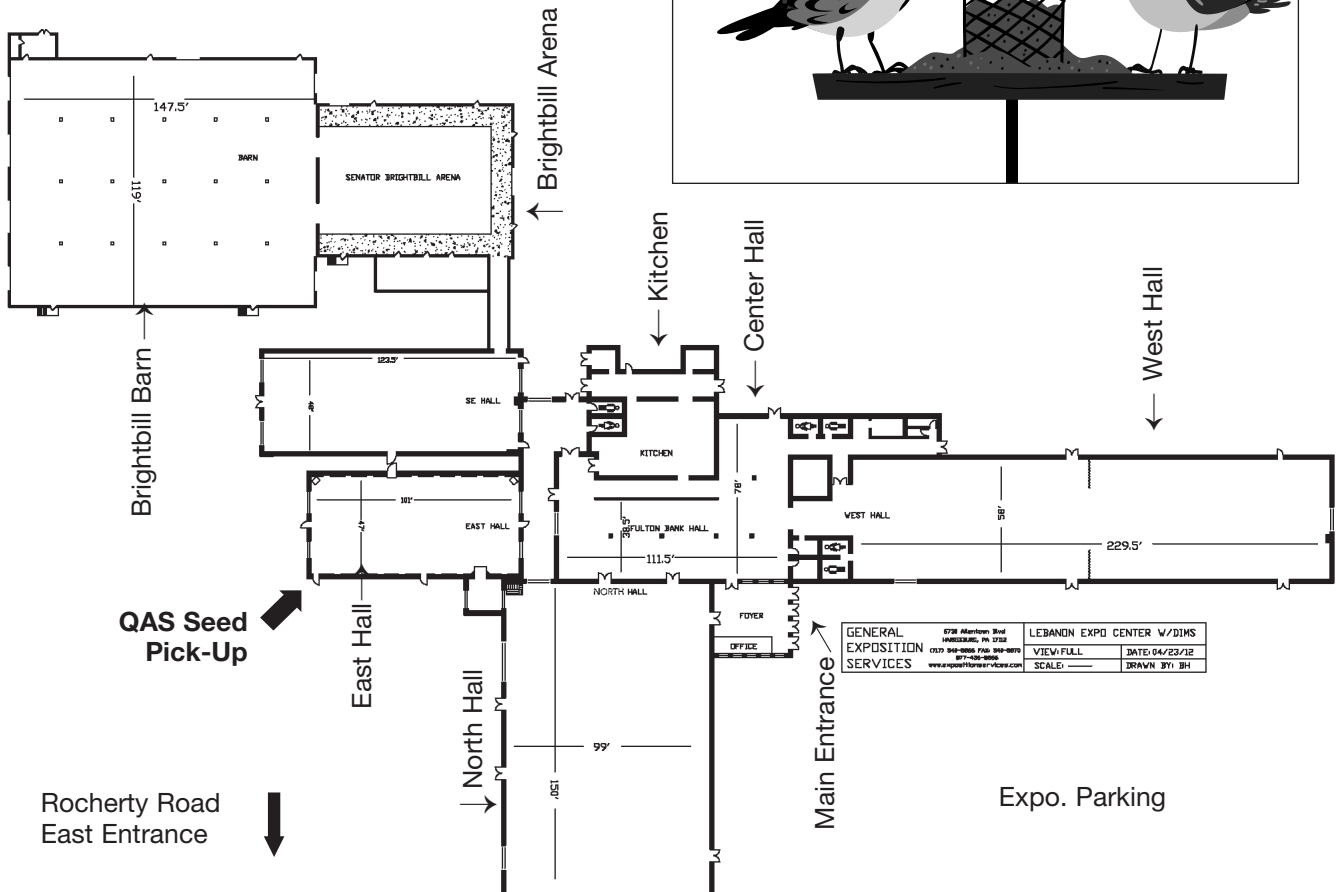
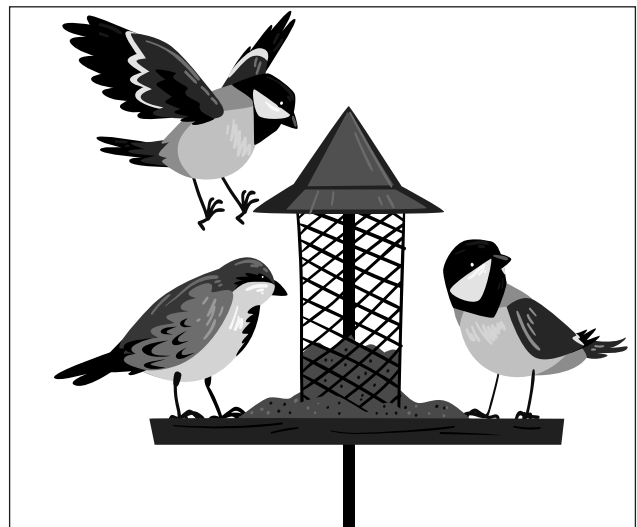
PICK-UP DATE

Wild Bird Seed Descriptions

Black Oil Sunflower – The birds' #1 choice in sunflower seed. Thinner shells, high seed-to-shell ratio, contains more energy-producing nutrition.

Sunflower Chips – The same high energy feed as regular sunflower seeds without the mess of shells. Attracts the same wide range of birds as the whole seed.

Safflower Seed – A favorite food of Cardinals, but Squirrels hate it. Becoming very popular.

Nyjer (Thistle) Seed – (Note new spelling) – A favorite of Goldfinches, Pine Siskins and Redpolls.

Split Peanuts – Halves and quarters, not hearts. Excellent for Chickadees and Titmice.

Peanut Hearts – A high energy food favored by Chickadees, Woodpeckers, and Blue Jays.

Cracked Corn – A good food for Doves, Juncos, and Cardinals.

Ultimate (Best Blend) – Black oil sunflower, white proso millet, split peanuts, safflower, sunflower chips, red proso millet.

Conservation Mix (Better Blend) – 40% black oil sunflower, 30% white millet, 30% cracked corn.

Classic (Good Blend) – 40% cracked corn, 20% white millet, 20% wheat, 20% black oil sunflower seed.

Patio/Deck Blend (no shells—no cleanup) – 50% sunflower chips, 25% hulled white millet, 25% split peanuts.

High Energy Suet Seed Cake – Beef suet, sunflower seeds, millet and corn.

Peanut Butter Suet Cake – Beef suet, chopped peanuts, and peanut butter.
